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## The President's Message

Dear Members,



For the past years we have lived, and in some cases continue to live, under the cloud of the COVID variants and the flu. This cloud has, if nothing else, made us more aware of isolation and loneliness.

## Social isolation and loneliness: what's the difference, and what can we do?

Social isolation and loneliness are often used interchangeably, but are they the same thing? Not exactly.

#### What is social isolation?

Social isolation refers to a measurable deficiency in the number of social relationships a person has - so it's about the frequency of social interaction and the number of connections you have.

#### What is loneliness?

Loneliness is related but different - it's more subjective. It's an unpleasant sensation when your social relationships are lacking in quality and quantity compared to what you want.

#### What's the relationship between social isolation and loneliness?

While the terms mean different things, their impact is related, as are the approaches for dealing with them. A 2019 survey from the Angus Reid Institute showed that those who are very isolated were also more likely to be very lonely. And if the lack of quality contacts can lead to loneliness, then efforts to reduce social isolation, for example, through group activities, can also impact loneliness by creating opportunities for meaningful connection.

Let us take advantage of the quality group activities RTOERO District 14 offers you to overcome social isolation and loneliness. Join in our various activities and share your talents locally by participating as either an onlooker or as a member of a Committee. I again encourage you to go to the RTOERO website to watch/participate in their various webinars.

#### POLITICAL ADVOCACY COMMITTEE

The members of the PAC have been very busy these Fall and Winter months responding to the many health concerns that have crippled the Health System in the Niagara Region. One of our members reported a very dangerous situation that arose in an emergency call after she had taken a serious fall and fractured her shoulder bone. They sent a TAXI to take her to Emergency. She was unable to walk and could not sit up. The taxi driver told her that she should have given more details when she called! She then waited another 4 hours before an ambulance arrived. We decided to take action. A letter of concern was sent to three officials to inquire as to the change of EMERGENCY procedures and change in policy. We did receive

and change in policy. We did receive responses but no clear cut answer to the question itself. We will pursue the action until we can share this vital information with all of our members.



We were directed to an online service that will give you answers to your urgent care concerns. There is no cost as it is covered by your ONTARIO HEALTH CARD. The Website address is UrgentCareOntario.ca.

RTOERO has also sent a letter to the Minister regarding the state of our health care system and the lack of funding to attract more doctors and nurses to our hospitals and clinics. The passing of Bill 7 was also addressed. Bill 7 enabled long-term care residents to be moved out of hospitals and relocated to another long-term care facility not of their choosing. All of the groups stated that this Bill promoted the use of COERCIVE

TACTICS over consent. We continue to monitor this situation.

We also supported the ongoing negotiations with the Ontario government and the Education Workers union. Bill Doyle provided apples on the picket lines from District 14 Niagara members. We urge our members to continue contact any of their representatives to express their support for the Education sector workers who keep our schools open and safe.

Finally, we regret the passing of one of the long time members of PAC. Don Gray was an active participant and volunteered his time to the group as a member of PAC and was on the Executive/Board for many years. He will be missed.

Please send us any concerns or issues you may have and we will endeavour to track it for you.

#### BENEFITS UPDATE

RTOERO is Canada's largest provider of non-profit group health insurance for those 50+ who work in the education sector and for those retired from education. Starting January 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, you are required to submit your claims within six months from the date the expense was incurred. If you visited your podiatrist on January 9, 2023 you must submit your claim before July 8, 2023. Any expense incurred on or before December 31, 2022 must be received by June 30, 2023.

With her untimely passing in 2020, the Rotary Club decided to

support her dream by developing The Clarice West-Hobbs Contemplative Garden to be located along the entire west-facing facade of the hospital building. On their behalf, District 14 submitted an application to

RTOERO's Community Grant Program. We are pleased to announce that this application has been approved, and \$4,000 will go to the Rotary Club for this project. A cheque for that amount was presented to Eric Jones, the Chairperson of the Clarice West-Hobbs Contemplative Garden Committee of the St. Catharines Lakeshore Rotary Club.





The Project is now entering Phase 2 which will continue the work of creating a quiet, restful place with the placement of Sitting Rocks installed in the grassed and treed areas between the existing sidewalks and service roadway.
